What Have We Done So Far?

Learning Mobilities

BUDAPEST, HUNGARY

26 participants, including youth, teachers, professionals, and parents, gathered in Budapest for a week focused on inclusion. The aim was to explore the **social context of inclusion**, highlighting the roles of institutional and family actors. Participants gained theoretical insights and firsthand experience through discussions with **external guests** and visits to **Romani communities** (Bag and Dány) projects led by Bagázs.



VALLETTA, MALTA

This mobility served as a testing ground for some of the activities included in the Toolkit, allowing young participants to gain practical knowledge about **group leadership** and **working with children**. This hands-on experience aimed to prepare them for their future **interventions with children, promoting diversity and inclusion**.

Additionally, visits were made to Maltese organizations working on the integration of vulnerable youth, and there was also time to explore some of the island's landmarks. A total of 46 students, teachers, parents, and professionals participated.



In 2025, we will have the final mobility of T4I, this time in Aveiro, Portugal, with a focus on dissemination and communication between and about diversity.

Creation of the Handbook and the Toolkit

The partners have begun developing the Handbook and Toolkit for T4I.

The **Handbook** serves as a guide for education professionals, such as teachers and social workers, to empower and engage diverse youth groups, bridging the gap between theory and practice.

The **Toolkit** provides practical activities and strategies for youth facilitators to create inclusive spaces for children, promoting social-emotional skills, diversity awareness, and collaboration across various settings.

T4I Youth Training

In February 2025, training will begin in the three partner countries to prepare young facilitators to manage groups and engage children aged 13 to 15 in promoting inclusion and diversity. Participants from diverse backgrounds will be empowered to lead **inclusive educational interventions**, the initiative's final major activity.
